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nineteenth century chamber music proceeds chronologically by composer beginning with the majestic works of beethoven and continuing through schubert spohr and weber mendelssohn schumann brahms the french composers smetana and dvorák and the end of the century pre modernists each chapter is written by a noted authority in the field the book serves as a general introduction to romantic chamber music and would be ideal for a seminar course on the subject or as an adjunct text for introduction to romantic music courses plus musicologists and students of 19th century music will find this to be an invaluable resource

this book documents the critiques and theorizings that working class african american women have drawn from their educational experiences based on a study of five african american females enrolled in an employer sponsored workplace speech and language training program the book presents lessons learned from participants efforts to negotiate effects of race class and gender discrimination both in and out of school particularly relevant to the field of education participants provide insight on the roles of teachers and schools instruction expectations motivation race and education educational experiences at work and relevant education to inform and help effect change because of its interdisciplinarity sisters of hope looking back stepping forward is an asset for a variety of courses that seek to be inclusive of the educational experiences and theorizings of marginalized groups its insights on race class gender marginalization and inequality are relevant to courses in areas such as african american studies women s studies ethnic studies multicultural education sociolinguistics black englishes history oral history autobiography communication and religion

this collection brings together approaches to the teacher education and preparation curriculum that may be described as holistic it also discusses teacher education curricula that are reconstructionist and reconceptualist in nature seeking to shift the trajectory of society through teacher education the book serves as an introductory text for the field of holistic curriculum studies and will open it up to a wider audience

pedagogy of place focuses on the embodiment of purposefully created space resulting from the creation and enactment of its participants cultural and social conditions it is also about education the purposeful creation of spaces that comprise learning environments and the aesthetic dimensions of the created space called school the essays present the concept of space the place where learning happens and where the lives of student and teacher can thrive or wither a place rich in human potential in an attempt to address the diversity of what we define as space pedagogy of place addresses issues around place and identity in three distinct strands as social as aesthetic and as political and historical as a collection these essays are attempts to open conversations with persons interested in what counts as curriculum teaching and learning within the spaces and places that release human potential and nurture the human spirit
